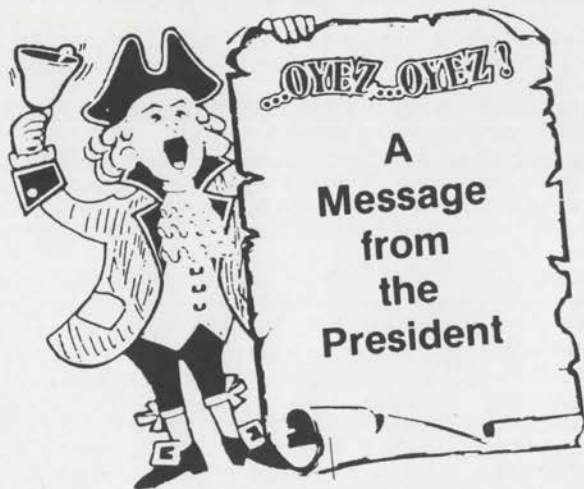

REFLECTIONS ON WARINGSTOWN

Some of my earliest cricketing memories involve the Waringstown club and its members. Without doubt all are fond memories of happy days playing in the sunshine of those idyllic summers of our youth.

My first introduction was as a guest player for Cork County on the 12th July 1965. In a game at Wallace Park a Waringstown player guested for Lisburn.

His score that day escapes me but was small. Local members said he was a great prospect and would play for Ireland. How right they were. The young man in question was Michael Reith and what a fine player he was. A most genial man off the field Michael played hard on the field but at all times was a most courteous and fair opponent. There were very few better players than Michael.

Around this time my Leprechauns activities first brought me into contact with another Waringstown stalwart Wesley Ferris. I well remember being most impressed with the steel rim on his boot. Thoughts of Gordon Rorke and the Trueman drag sprang to mind although to be fair Wesley had probably lost some of the fine edge of pace that saw him capped in the early 1950s. A thorough gentleman, I never heard him utter an unkind word even when the easiest of catches went astray.

1968 saw my first visit to the Lawn with Clontarf and around this era a number of Clontarf Waringstown games were played both at The Lawn and Castle Avenue. A dimming memory at this stage merely records keenly fought games with Waringstown invariably captained by that most pleasant of men Eddie McMullan. I do seem to recall a tie in a Beckett Cup Final around 1974 but I am not to sure if this is correct.

If there was a better Waringstown Irish player than Michael Reith it without any doubt was Ivan Anderson. In the eyes of most Ivan was the best ever bat to play for Ireland. At his best you could not bowl to him. Allied to superb batting was his fine bowling ability and brilliant fielding particularly in the covers. I saw many of his fine innings over the years and marvelled at his skill. I shall always treasure one shot he played in a Waringstown Clontarf game at Castle Avenue during our centenary week in 1976. Giving himself room he square drove Podge Hughes off Leg Stump past point for four. What a shot. What a player.

You cannot think of Waringstown without the name Harrison. This family has produced a most remarkable band of cricketers. Roy, Jim, Deryck and Garfield have all graced the Irish sweater with pride and distinction. I would not care to speculate which of them was best. All have contributed in their own particular manner. All had or have slightly different styles of playing and each has succeeded in his own right. Ian Harrison was a prolific wicket taker with his off spin and must be considered unlucky not to have played for Ireland.

Other names who came to mind include Eddie Bushe, a very fine keeper who while he played for Ireland would have won many more caps but for the brilliance of the incomparable Ossie Colhoun. I must confess to attempting to attempt to ruin Eddie's reputation as a keeper. In 190 I played for Des Cashells XI in the Brigade 75th celebration game. There was a printed scorecard and Eddie was the keeper. However a continuing league game meant Eddie could not play. I was pressed into service. As I proceeded to miss several stumping chances including one with the great Brian Close stranded down the track a local Brigade supporter no doubt very partisan remarked to Ian Johnston "No matter what you say our Ossie is better than your Eddie Bushe" Johntie agreed. "

You're absolutely right"!! Sorry Eddie.

The 1990 Waringstown includes the new breed of Irish players Garfield now a fixture, Alan Nelson, Davie Dennison, Alvin Spence and the McCrums now with North Down.

Whatever the strengths or weaknesses of Waringstown or indeed Clontarf since those early years my abiding thoughts relate more to fine games played at club or Inter Provincial level rather than who won or lost. I think of the friendships made playing with and against many Waringstown players down the years at all levels. While we all play hard to win and it can be no other way — I expect and hope Clontarf win today — ultimately as the years go by I tend to forget the results.

For the past 25 years or so Waringstown have been one of the finest club sides in the country and this without benefit of outside agencies. As we enter the 1990s Waringstown appear to be going from strength to strength.

Keep it up, good luck to you and long may Waringstown flourish.



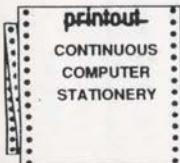

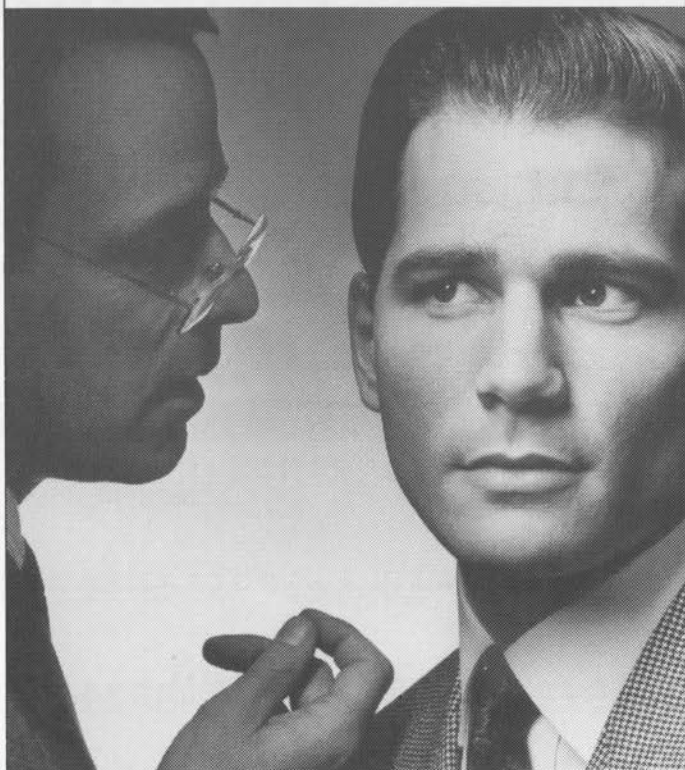

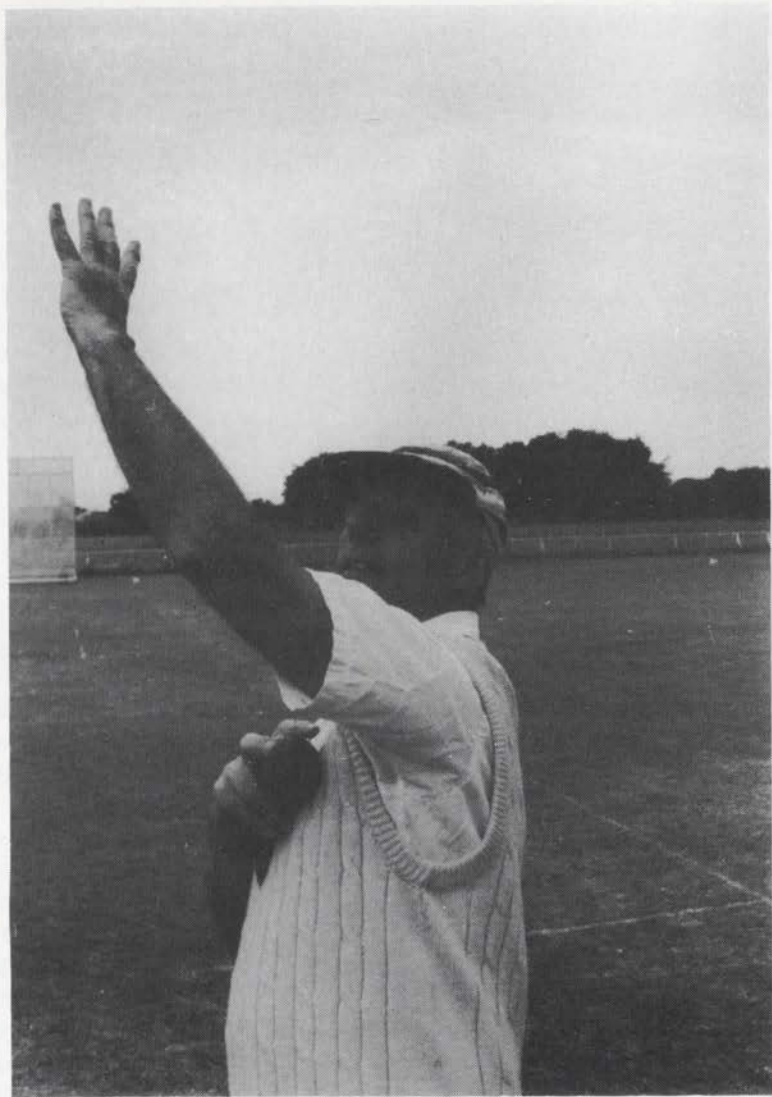

EDITORIAL

Nevertheless we are sure the contest however fierce will be conducted with the utmost good sportsmanship by both sides. Winners and losers will join each other afterwards in the bar to discuss the day's play and the might have been so further cementing a Clontarf-Waringstown friendship going back nearly thirty years.

No doubt the pluperfect subjunctive will reign supreme!

It is a singular pleasure to meet Waringstown in this competition as they like us conduct their playing without benefit of the overseas professional player. Our two clubs think alike on this contentious subject. While professional coaching is a thoroughly admirable goal we each feel any competition is only worth winning from our own resources. Have the players coached yes but then let them play and display the skills they have is. Would the I.C.U. had a similar approach with the Iris XI.

Exactly what was achieved by playing Lamba in games this year? Was his presence in any of the games worth the fee (however small)? What price was paid in terms of team spirit?

There may be an argument for playing such as Lamba in the Nat. West., but surely none for the New Zealand or Worcestershire games. Even then his club contract permitted play in only one of the Worcestershire games. The I.C.U. are now considering a full time player coach for 1991. We will return to this subject in a later editorial or article and discuss the merits or otherwise of such a proposal. For today we will conclude by opining that the Lamba selection was nothing short of an unmitigated blunder and disaster from start to finish. An ill-conceived concept with little chance of any benefits long or short-term for Irish cricket.
