





Past Times

The cricket pitch in Clontarf used to be where the rugby pitch is now and the wickets ran in the opposite direction to the current square. The sun used to cause some problems over the bowler's arm similar to Cabra and Leinster and this lead to an interesting exchange of letters between the Club and the M.C.C.

The Secretary Marlebone Cricket Club London 21 Mount Prospect Avenue Clontarf Dublin

13 August 1937

Dear Sir,

I shall feel much obliged if you will kindly give me a ruling upon a point which frequently arises and upon which there appears to be a difference of opinion here.

The wicket on the Clontarf Cricket Club runs East and West and during evening matches in August, the sun sinking low in the west makes it exceedingly awkward for the batsman, especially as the bowler's arm is practically in a direct line with the sun.

The point on which ruling is requested is:-

"Under these conditions can an appeal against the light be sustained?"

A Reply came quickly

Lord's Cricket Ground St. John's Wood NW8 16th August 1937 Ref L43/14

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 13th instant, I beg to inform you that MCC can only give decisions on the Laws of Cricket to Secretaries, or to authorised representatives of recognised Clubs, and only when the incident mentioned has actually happened.


As well as stories, the 64-page, pocket-sized book contains discussions on aspects of umpiring as well as questions designed to stimulate the reader to get the gray matter going. It will come as no surprise to find that Alan has not been slow to offer opinions on several matters, although he is quite prepared for people to disagree with them. "One of the fascinations of cricket is that there can often be more than one view of difficult points - that's what we spend our time chatting about in the bar!"

Thinking about Cricket Umpiring is intended primarily for those who have some experience of umpiring. It will be especially useful for those who are preparing for umpiring examinations or who are looking for a new way of brushing up their knowledge. Because cricket can be a 'funny game' it is light-hearted at times and it is hoped that it will entertain scorers and all serious cricket-lovers too.

THE FOLLOWING IS AND EXAMPLE OF THE BOOK'S CONTENTS:-

Bill was the non-striker and was just beginning to settle into his innings when the ball flashed down his partner's leg-side, Bill called and ran. As he turned at the striker's end, he saw the umpire turn away to signal the wide which he didn't called. 'Just my luck to get out now when I needn't have run at all", thought Bill. Next ball - bowled! The moral of the story is call the wide as soon as the ball passes the line of the striker's wicket (Law 25.1).

Alan is also Training Officer for the LCUA and anyone interested in taking up umpiring should contact him.



 organised a Massager for his team (so he thinks111)


