
### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

This is a fantastic achievement and CCC offers congratulations to all the participants on their performances



### **GERRY RING - AN APPRECIATION**

News of the death of another of the club's great characters always brings a sense of sadness and loss. However, when the person concerned is only 34 years old and renowned for his "joie de vivre", the news is especially tragic. Club members were stunned to learn of the sudden illness and untimely passing of Gerald Ring - a popular member who had lived in Sligo in recent years. We extend our deepest sympathy to his family.

In the 80's, when all the 20 somethings in the club alternated between C.C.C. and the famous (or infamous?) Hampton, Gerry was our "Music Man". Whenever a crowd congregated in the bar, especially after big games, someone would be sent to Hampton to pick up a guitar so that Ringo could entertain us. He would launch into "Mucky Kid" or "Me and the Elephant" before the musical choices for the evening could be dictated by some of our less tuneful members!

One of my most vivid memories of Gerry and his guitar is of him trying to keep a straight face while accompanying Mighty and Peter in one of their heartfelt renditions of "Leaving on a Jet Plane". It took a huge amount of concentration to adjust to their sudden key changes, and after the first few lines Gerry would give up on trying to sing loudly to keep them in tune.

Ringo's talent for the guitar also meant that he was in much demand for functions such as the Ladies Supper where he was a guaranteed performer. Even since his move to Sligo his name came up every year in the discussion about the entertainment for the Supper. Of course, most years, his name would also feature in the ode to the season. Before Hazel came along1Gerry was considered fair game by many members of the ladies club. When he volunteered to coach the ladies 3rd X1 there were murmurs about ulterior motives, especially when he favoured a "hands on" technique to







### "MEMORIES"

### **SENIOR 2 CUP**

Semi - finals The Hills 11 lost to Pembroke 11 by 7 wickets. Railway Union 11 lost to Clontarf 11 by 146 runs.

Final September 5th at Phoenix

Clontarf 11 beat Pembroke11 by 3 wickets.

Pembroke 11.234 for 4 (5 Mammino 126, E Dwyer 53, R Murphy 36) Clontarf 11.237 for 7 (M Traynor 80, J Barry 60, J. Davy 3 for 39).

Rain at the semifinal stage caused postponement of the final and a new date could not be found until September. When eventually played it was one of the most memorable finals for many years. Despite some trepidation about early morning life in the wicket Pembroke batted on winning the toss. It seemed justified. Openers Eddie Dwyer and Australian visitor Simon Mammino were undefeated at lunch. A total of 250 looked a possibility but the overs either side of the interval Were not as productive as they might have been. Then good hitting by Richard Murphy and a final flourish by Mammino, with both departing only in the final over, gave a score that even Clontarf supporters reckoned was enough to carry the day. For a long time it appeared so.

Several Clontarf batsmen got a start but only skipper Mark Traynor built a major innings. Opening bowler John Davy bowled well while legspinner Paddy Gallagher maintained an excellent line and length and was never collared . With six wickets down and almost 100 runs needed off about 20 overs the match seemed over. Clontarf had one hope. It was generally felt that the Pembroke change bowling was relatively weak. Many spectators were surprised at the decision not to use up some of their overs in the early stages of the innings when they might have been treated with some caution. In the end it proved crucial. Clontarf's last hope was some useful blows from hitter Johonny Barry. Coming in at number eight he rode his luck from the start. with Davy bowled out, Pembroke were depending on good fielding to support their weaker bowlers. Several chances were missed and Barry got his eye well in. Traynor's watchful knock ended as the score reached 200 but by now Barry was in full flow. The experienced Collie Daly provided steady support although there was still a runout chance that should have been taken and Clontarf were home with an over to spare. Barry's Innings made him the obvious Man of the Match.

### **GROUNDS FOR DEVELOPMENT**

The Irish Times of 3 July reported that Castle Avenue was on of two grounds which will be developed by the Irish Cricket Union to international playing standards. The other ground is at the Civil Service ground in Belfast. While the committee are awaiting full details from the ICU as to what this involves, it is undoubtedly an honour and indeed a great responsibility for the club.

We are very proud of our facilities in Clontarf and are always seeking to improve, where ever we can. The recent purchase of new covers is but one example of this commitment. We now have the opportunity to sit down with the ICU and discuss both our visions for the future development of Castle Avenue.

The initiative comes about following the International Cricket Conference's decision to promote Ireland as an "emerging nation" with potential to attain full one day international status. This process began less than one year ago when Dr. Ali Bacher visited Castle Avenue on an information seeking visit. Proof that things can happen quickly.

The performance of the senior side in Malaysia, where they narrowly failed to reach the World Cup finals and more recently the performance of the under 19 side in Bermuda have shown that the ICC support is well placed, however, at local level, we must now look to develop the playing pool and facilities.

As mentioned it is still unclear what exactly the "developments" will be, however, given the need to provide seating for ICC approved games this is one area which will probably be under discussion. It is likely that the ICU will wish to discuss our playing facilities as well.

Clontarf are not afraid of progress, indeed we welcome it, however, rest assured that the members will have their input and any ideas are welcomed by the committee.

coach bowlers. However, as with everything he did, Gerry threw himself wholeheartedly into his coaching long after the initial attraction had faded. When the Ring family approached us about presenting a cup in Ringo's memory, it seemed appropriate that it be awarded to 3rd bowler as they were always his pet project.

Ringo was the sort of player that you loved to have on your team as he brought camaraderie and team spirit with him wherever he went. He was a great admirer of cricketing excellence, with a real affection for big hitters, and was a firm believer in sportsmanship. While he was very competitive, he didn't overstep the mark between competition and aggression. thus, he was very embarrassed when a frustrated kick at a ball (which had beaten him to the boundary) led to the ball rebounding off the windscreen of a car. The startled look of the occupant of the car (a tea lady of note), led Gerry to a quick wave of apology before having the ignoming of having to chase down the carpark after the ball.

Whatever Gerry was involved in, he always gave 100%, and he was greatly missed by many varied groups when his work took him to Sligo. When he got married and his three lovely daughters arrived, he brought the same 100% commitment to his new role as a family man, while still forging links with various clubs in Sligo, and maintaining contact with his many friends in Dublin. Gerry was a wonderful person for bringing people together, and it was typical of him that his final big effort in this respect was to organise a fund raiser to provide hand bells for the Camphill Community. He knew very well the therapeutic, effects of music.

Gerry touched so many lives with his music and his wonderful sense of fun. We, the Hampton gang of the 80° s now find ourselves regaling the "young ones" with stories of the "good old days" in the club, where Ringo was always in the centre of things. The memories of the man and his music will live for a long time in the hearts of Clontarf Cricket Club.


